7:00 p.m. Bruce Municipal Drain 2017 – Engineers' Report

Matt Ash, Senior Project Manager with GM BluePlan Engineering attended before Council to present the Engineer's Report for the Bruce Municipal Drain 2017 serving Lots 12 to 14, Concessions 16, 17 and 18, Grey Ward. Mr. Ash advised that based on the information obtained at the on-site meeting and the subsequent topographical survey, it has been determined that the tile drain that currently services the landowners contained within the watershed does not have sufficient size to convey runoff flows. Complete replacement of the existing drain has been proposed, with capacity to accommodate current drainage standards and eliminate wet areas, blowouts and plugs of drainage structures.

Matt Ash, Senior Project Manager with GM BluePlan Engineering attended before Council to present the Engineer's Report for the McKee Municipal Drain 2017 serving Lots 19 to 23, Concessions 6 and 7, Grey Ward. Mr. Ash advised that based on the information obtained at the on-site meeting, from previous reports, the topographic survey, and a site inspection, it was determined that the tile drain that currently services the landowners contained within the watershed does not have sufficient size to convey runoff flows. Wet areas were noticed in multiple areas along the existing drain, as well as areas of localized ponding. Full replacement of the existing drain has been proposed, with capacity to accommodate current drainage standards.

REPORTS & RECOMMENDATIONS OF MUNICIPAL OFFICERS

<u>Finance Manager-Treasurer/Deputy Clerk – 2017 Budget – 3rd Draft</u>

Finance Manager-Treasurer/Deputy Clerk Paula Michiels presented the 3rd draft of the 2017 Budget for consideration by Council. The Finance Manager advised the following adjustments have been made to the budget as directed by Council:

- cut the Public Works backhoe (\$150,000)
- add the estimated costs to repair the backhoe \$19,000
- adjust the municipal levy increase to 5% through the one time draw on the Bridge reserves

In conclusion, the Finance Manager noted that the budget was now balanced with a 5% Municipal levy increase. The County levy increase is 4.3% but because of shifts in farmland values, Huron East's overall levy for the County is 9.31% higher. This shift is beyond the control of Huron East. The Education tax rate has not been released by the Province and once this number is available, the overall tax levies by ward can be provided. The final public budget meeting is scheduled for April 4th, 2017.

<u>Finance Manager-Treasurer/Deputy Clerk – Bill 73 – Smart Growth for Our Communities Act</u>

Finance Manager-Treasurer/Deputy Clerk Paula Michiels reviewed her report to Council concerning Bill 73 – Smart Growth for Our Communities Act. It was noted that Bill 73 has been proclaimed and includes a number of changes to the <u>Development Charges Act</u> and the <u>Planning Act</u>. Section 42(17) of the <u>Planning Act</u> requires the Treasurer to give an annual statement to Council on the activity in the Parkland Reserve account. Council were provided a statement on the Parkland Reserve to date and advised this report will be updated and produced annually for Council.

Moved by Kevin Wilbee and seconded by Alvin McLellan:

as amended, accept the Treasurer's statement of the Parkland Reserve account showing a balance of \$15,507.92 at the end of 2016. Carried.

<u>CAO/Clerk – County Emergency Management Coordinator (CEMC)</u>

CAO/Clerk Brad Knight reviewed his report to Council concerning the concept of the CEMC position being provided at the County level. In 2016 there were discussions initiated by the County of the lower tier municipalities moving this responsibility to the County. The CAO advised that this proposal is not being viewed as a measure to achieve cost savings but more of a means to maintain the necessary qualifications and establish emergency preparedness consistency across the lower tiers within the County. It was noted that if a lower tier expresses interest in the proposal, a more formal agreement will be entered into at a later date.

THAT Council of the Municipality of Huron East endorses the concept of each municipality within the County of Huron appointing the same Community Emergency Management Coordinator (CEMC) to provide emergency management planning services, in accordance with the requirements of the Emergency Management & Civil Protection Act and its regulations;

The CAO/Clerk advised that Sherrie Oliver had contacted him about conducting civil marriage solemnization services and had recently completed the AMCTO course to provide the service.

7:30 p.m. Stop Up, Close and Sell – Part of Silver Creek Road Allowance (By-Law 25-2017)

CAO/Clerk Brad Knight reviewed his report to Council providing background on the proposed road closing and explained the process to date. The CAO advised that notices had been circulated to adjoining property owners within 400' of the subject lands and no objections had been received to the proposed road closing. Council were advised that By-Law 25-2017 proposes to convey the unopened part of the Silver Creek Road Allowance to the owner of the vacant lots in what is commonly known as the "Silvercreek Subdivision". The Municipality does propose to retain an easement on Part 4 and 6 on the draft reference plan as the route of the sanitary sewer into the JL Retirement Development. It was noted that the watermain easement on Part 4 for the Kluz Development will be drafted when the location of the watermain has become determined. The CAO also advised that Kluz Development will be responsible for all legal and advertising costs along with a land value of \$9,600 which is based on Policy 1.15 (\$7,500 per acre for road allowances).

The Public Works Coordinator reviewed his report to Council concerning the tender for the reconstruction of Winnipeg Road, Toronto Boulevard and Regina Road in Vanastra. It was noted that five tenders were received prior to March 10th, 2017 at 12:00 noon and opened in the presence of Deputy Mayor Steffler, Finance Manager Paula Michiels, Public Works Coordinator Barry Mills and Dennis Elliott of BM Ross & Associates Limited. <u>Public Works Coordinator – 5-Ton Plow Truck</u>

Public Works Coordinator Barry Mills reviewed his report to Council concerning the purchase of a 2017 5-ton snow plow truck. It was noted the item is included in the 2017 Budget however it was suggested that staff inquire into the availability of a Demo snow plow truck that would be ready for the 2017-2018 snow season. Inquiries were made for a fully equipped demo snow plow truck with various truck and body suppliers. Viking Cives were the only supplier with a demo unit available that meets the municipality's specification. Quotations were also obtained for a new 2018 model in the amount of \$258,386.21 and \$278,621.21 (taxes not included).
