Evergreen Holsteins Inc. – Deferred Consideration of Zoning Amendment By-Law 19-2018

At the April 3rd, 2018 Public Meeting, Council deferred a decision on Zoning Amendment By-Law 19-2018 to allow the applicant an opportunity to review the concerns raised by the neighbours. Concerns included the size of the dairy barn expansion, the amount of the reduction in the MDS requirement, increased traffic and impact on their property and drainage concerns. The application has been revised and reviewed by the Chief Building Official and Planner. Notices advising that modifications have been made to the application along with a copy of the Planners Report to be considered by Council at the April 17th meeting were forwarded to all those in attendance at the public meeting on April 3rd, 2018.

Senior Planner Denise Van Amersfoort reviewed the Planners Report dated April 12th, 2018. Council were advised the applicant has discussed concerns with the neighbours to the south and have revised their building location, dimensions of the barn and capacity of the new dairy barn facility. The original application required a reduction of 75 metres (250 feet) from the required MDS and the revised location of the barn and slight reduction in overall size/capacity now required a reduction of 18 metres (59 feet) to the required MDS. Ms. Van Amersfoort also indicated that the applicant was also proposing the development of a new farm laneway to the east onto Johnston Line which would reduce some of the traffic on Brandon Road. She further indicated that the neighbour to the south who are subject to the MDS calculations have advised that if the proposed barn is aligned with the frontage of the existing dairy barn, they have no objection to the application. It was also noted that a drainage plan is being requested as part of the building permit. Ms. Van Amersfoort advised that with the modifications, the zoning by-law amendment conforms to the Huron East Official Plan, the County Official Plan, and is consistent with the Provincial Policy Statement and recommended the zoning by-law amendment be approved.

The Chief Building Official Report for March 2018 was received by Council.

CAO/Clerk – Fire Agreements with North Huron

The CAO/Clerk Brad Knight reviewed his report to Council providing background on the ongoing negotiations between the municipalities of North Huron and Huron East regarding a shared agreement between the two municipalities with respect to the services of the Fire Chief and some reciprocal fire services in the form of Fire Prevention Officer services from North Huron. Council were advised that North Huron have passed by-laws to authorize the Agreements and appoint Marty Bedard as Fire Chief. It was also noted that provisions are in the Agreements for either party to give notice of termination of the agreement at any time. By-laws to authorize the Agreements will be considered later in the meeting. A by-law will also be considered to appoint Michael Roess as a Fire Prevention Officer.

CAO/Clerk – Implementation of Waste Collection by Waste Management Canada

CAO/Clerk Brad Knight reviewed his report to Council concerning implementation of waste collection in the Tuckersmith and Seaforth wards by Waste Management Canada. He noted that Waste Management was scheduled to commence collection on July 1st, but with Brown's Sanitation going out of business on March 6th, Waste Management's commencement date was moved forward to May 4th. He noted that garbage collection in both wards will be on Fridays and that Bluewater Recycling had also moved their recycling collection to Fridays. Information flyers will be mailed to every household in Seaforth and Tuckersmith and advertising will be in the local papers and on the Huron East website advising of the changes. Council were advised that the bag tag fees in Huron East range from \$2.00 to \$3.25 and it was recommended that a bag tag fee of \$2.50 be implemented in all Wards in Huron East.

CAO/Clerk – 2018 Municipal Election

CAO/Clerk Brad Knight reviewed his report to Council providing an update on the 2018 municipal elections. Council were advised that nominations can be filed from May 1st, 2018 until 2:00 p.m. on Friday, July 27th, 2018. It was noted there will be a Candidate Information Session in Clinton on June 27th, 2018 with speakers from the Ministry of Municipal Affairs speaking to the municipal election process. Council were also advised that candidates packages are available at the municipal office or on the website.

Fire Chief – Grey Firehall Addition

Fire Chief Marty Bedard reviewed his report to Council on the Grey Firehall addition. He noted that the project was deferred from last year as the overall concept of the addition was not finalized and there had not been enough budgeted for the addition. He indicated that plans have been finalized with an addition of approximately 10 feet wider to accommodate separate storage/mechanical rooms and that the budget allotment for the addition was increased in the 2018 budget to \$85,000.

Public Works Coordinator – Center Line Painting – Rural Wards

Public Works Coordinator Barry Mills reviewed his report to Council concerning a proposed Center Line Painting on Paved Rural Roads Policy. He advised that the policy was drafted based on a threshold of 250 vehicles per day and would result in 103.92 km or 60% of our 172.88 km of rural roads receiving the center line painting. He further noted that the current costs for painting are approximately \$262 per km and with approximately 50% of the 104 km of roads proposed to be painted each year, this program will have an annual budget impact of between \$13,000 and \$14,000.

Draft Huron Natural Heritage Plan

Huron County Senior Planner Denise Van Amersfoort reviewed her report to Council providing an update on the draft Huron Natural Heritage Plan. It was noted that public consultation for the draft Plan was held in the fall of 2016. In February of 2017, Huron County Council received the draft report for information and provided direction on adjacent lands (to be considered 120m from provincially significant wetlands and 50m from all other features). In addition, County Council directed the mapping be updated to reflect the 2015 aerial photography. She advised that with updated mapping, further public consultation will be held in May of 2018 and following the public consultation process, the draft Natural Heritage Plan will return to Huron County Council for consideration
